







## **Current Employment Statistics (CES)**


Total Nonagricultural Employment Florida Vs. United States Not Seasonally Adjusted






### **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)**




# Annual Labor Force Change






### Annual Unemployment Change








## **Occupational Employment Statistics (OES)**



To update the scatter plot, select an area and occupational group. 'Florida' and 'Business and Financial Operations Occupations' are selected by default.

Note: The average wage reference line is calculated by the sum of mean wages divided by the number of occupations. It is not a weighted average by employment.




'Financial Analysts' and 'Mean Wage' are selected by default.




