Federal Claims Control Center Purpose

The FCCC was established by US DOL to be the official source of military wage and separation information for States to determine UCX entitlement. It maintains the Department's copy of the DD214 and/or DD215 for UCX purposes. The FCCC also maintains a system of "claims control records" for program integrity purposes.



FCCC Request Processing Overview

It is the State's responsibility to ensure the proper Federal Claims Control Center (FCCC) record is sent to the HUB each time an initial claim involving Federal civilian (UCFE) or Federal military (UCX) wages is filed.

FCCC request records should be integrated into the claims filing process. In addition, each State must provide a process for staff to independently create and electronically send to the Hub all 6 types of FCCC request records.

OVERVIEW OF FCCC RECORD TYPES

| UCFE/UCX RECORD TYPES | | |
|---|--|--|
| Type of Record | Event | When to Use |
| Type 1 – Initial Request for Wage & Separation Information | Claim Filed | Each time a UCFE/UCX claim is filed |
| Type 2 – UCFE or UCX or Joint Claim Control | Benefit Year Established | Each time a benefit year is established using UCFE, UCX or a combination of both types of wages. |
| Type 3 – Wage Assignment Only | Benefit Year Established – Lag Period Wages | When a UI benefit year is established with causes the assignment of lag period UCX or UCFE wages. When a benefit year is established under another state’s law which causes a wage assignment in your state. |
| Type 4 – Cancellation of Type 2 Claim Control | Cancellation of Control Record | When a benefit year that caused an assignment is canceled. |
| Type 5 – Cancellation of Type 3 Wage assignment Only Control | Benefit Year Cancelled using Lag Wages | When a benefit year that caused an assignment is canceled. |
| Type 6 – Cancellation of UCX Pending Record | Withdrawal of UCX Claim or Erroneous Information Caused Pending Record | When a UCX claim is withdrawn or canceled, or when erroneous information (e.g. incorrect separation date on the Type 1 record) caused an erroneous pending record to be created. |



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

A **Type 1** request **must** be sent to FCCC each time a new initial claim involving Federal wages is filed
(both civilian & military - even on transitional claims)

A Type 1 request serves two purposes, it enables a State to:

- Find out if a claim has been established which assigned Federal wages
- Receive the “official” UCX wage and separation information

Note: UCX wages returned on a Type 1 response does NOT mean the wages can automatically be used to establish a benefit year. Edit/Process flag is your 1st action indicator, followed by messages, completed 1st full term of service & character of service.

➤ Before using UCX wages, staff must review the entire response, especially the edit/process flag and message number, to determine proper claims filing options. If, after reviewing the response it is determined a benefit year may be established using UCFE or UCX wages, a Type 2 request must be sent to FCCC. Remember, the military branches are reviewing our records in MSDES and will protest if necessary.



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

Every FCCC request will receive a response. Every response must be reviewed by state workforce agency.

Depending on what is found during processing of a Type 1 request you could receive different response Types. These are some samples:

Type 1 response with wages. (determine if wages are usable)

Type 1 response with no wages. (If claimant provides proper proof of wages you may take an affidavit)

Type 1 response with “E” in edit/process flag indicating request could not be processed (fix error(s) and submit new Type 1 request)

Type 2 response indicating control card on file. (contact State with existing control card to determine further course of action)

Type 3 response indicating control card file. (contact state with existing control card to determine further course of action)



UCX AFFIDAVIT PROCESS

FCCC response with a message that says: “..... Response Pending” indicates approval for State to take affidavit using the following:

- ✓ DD214 (not member 1) OR
- ✓ “orders to report” AND “orders of release”
- OR
- ✓ “orders to report” containing an endorsement of release



UCX AFFIDAVIT PROCESS

(cont'd)

NOTE: When taking an affidavit using a DD214

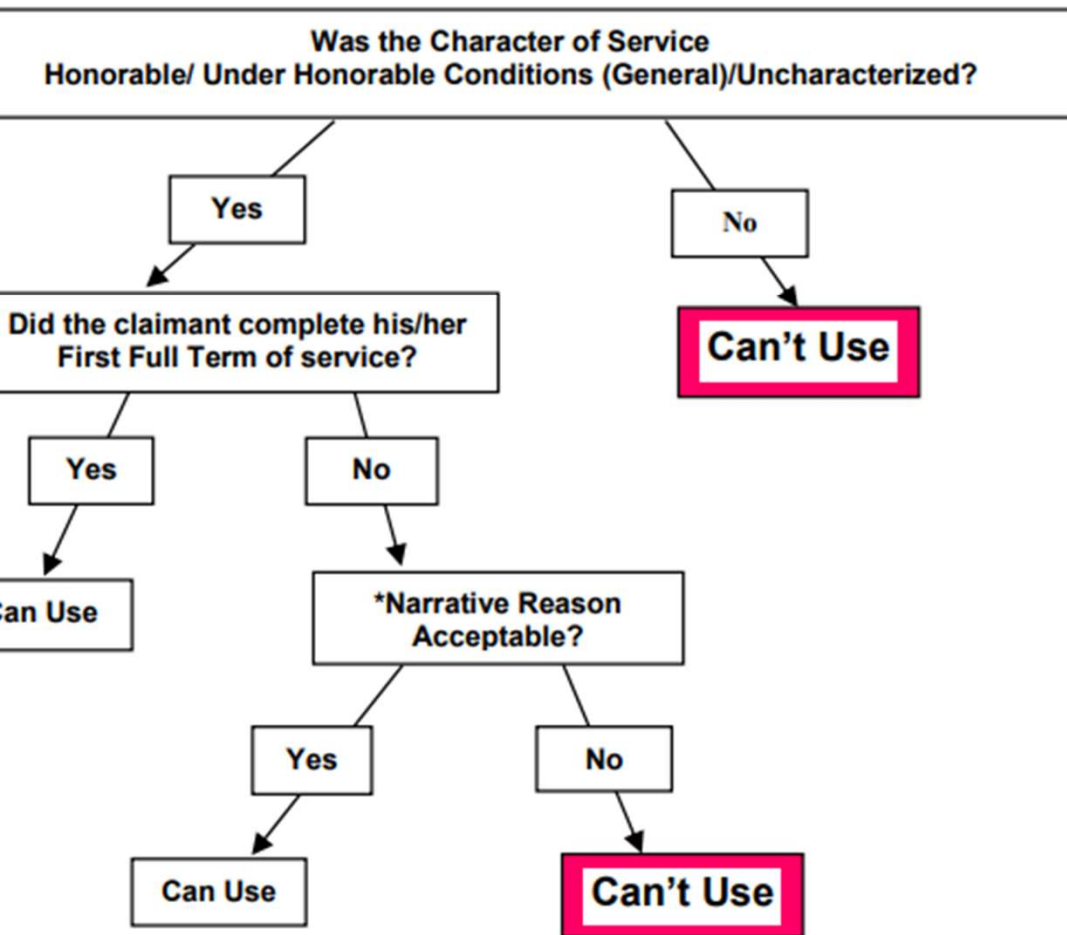
- A DD214 sent to you directly (by the military via USPS or MSDES) must be signed and must be considered an affidavit until you receive a Type 1 response from FCCC with the “official” UCX wage and separation information
- An electronic signature on a DD214 looks like this:

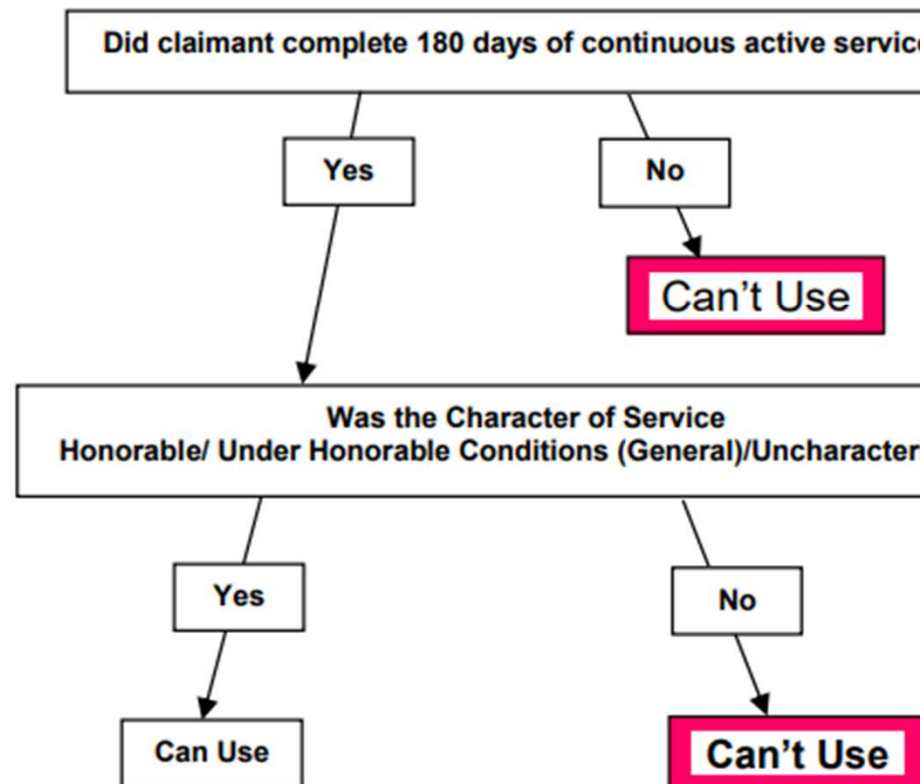


UCX DECISION TREE rev September 2020*

If a claimant was an Officer (check paygrade), please refer to ET Handbook No. 384, Unemployment Compensation for Ex-Servicemembers, for the use of Federal military service and wages.

Member Completed 1st full term

Currently, not every DD214/215 block 18 includes:

“member has completed 1st full term”

or

“member has not completed 1st full term”

For this reason, the FCCC response may have “U” unknown for “completed 1st full term.”

Note: States using MSDES should clarify any information related to the processing of a UCX claim by sending a State Acknowledgement to the military branch via MSDES. States not using MSDES should send an ETA 843 to the military branch to clarify information related to processing a UCX claim.



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

Type 2 - Request to post UCFE and/or UCX claims control data when a benefit year is established that uses Federal wages.

A type 2 request must be sent to FCCC under the following conditions:

- A benefit year is established based upon Federal civilian and/or Federal military wages.
- Federal or Federal Military wages have been transferred (via an IB4 response) and used to establish a benefit year in the Paying State. In this case, the Paying State sends the Type 2 request and includes the FIPS code of the Transferring State in field #14 (also field #15 if more than one Transferring State).

Note: A Type 2 request posts a claims control record of the establishment of a benefit year that assigned and used Federal wages. A Type 2 record is necessary for integrity purposes to lessen the chances of duplicate claims and overpayments. The Type 2 separation date must be correct. If a type 2 request record is not sent to FCCC there is no record of a benefit year being established.

Think of it this way.....When a Paying State establishes a benefit year using in state covered wages the wages are flagged as used to prevent duplicate use. This same thought process can be used for UCFE and/or UCX claims except the record of flagging wages as "assigned & used" is accomplished via a Type 2 FCCC request.



The creation of the MSDES website caused USDOL to ask all States to add some information to their UCX and Joint Type 2's they were sending to the UI-ICON Hub.

States were asked to add:
branch of service,
Weekly Benefit Amount,
Maximum Benefit Amount &
Dependent Allowance (if applicable).

Note: Reference UIPL 13-14 for UCX Automation details

**States Not sending WBA, MBA, DA & Branch:
AK, CA, NJ & RI**



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

Type 3 - Request to post UCFE and/or UCX claims control data when a benefit year is established that causes the assignment of LAG period ONLY Federal wages.

- A Type 3 request must be sent to FCCC whenever a benefit year is established which causes assignment of LAG PERIOD ONLY Federal civilian and/or Federal military wages. The sep date must be correct.
- Federal wages must be assigned at the 1st claim filed subsequent to separation.
(even if the Fed employer is the separating employer but NOT in the base period)
- Whenever a benefit year is established which includes UCX or UCFE wages a Type 2 or Type 3 must be sent to FCCC.

The difference between a Type 2 and a Type 3 are:

- Type 2 is sent whenever UCX or UCFE wages are included in the Base Period of the claim.
- Type 3 is sent whenever UCX or UCFE wages are in the LAG Period ONLY and are NOT in the Base Period of the claim.



Note: A Paying State should never send a Type 2 & Type 3 on the same program code & benefit year.

FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

Type 3 as a Transferring State???????

This is NOT likely but occasionally will happen :

- UCFE or UCX wages are transferred via IB4 and the UCFE or UCX separation date is after the Paying State base period end date
- If the Paying State establishes a benefit year, they will send FCCC a Type 2 with the Transferring State FIPS but in addition, there are LAG wages that must be assigned to Transferring State
- Under this scenario the Transferring State should send FCCC a Type 3 to take assignment of the LAG period wages

NOTE: This does NOT mean whenever UCFE or UCX wages are transferred that the Transferring State will send a Type 3



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

- **Type 4** - Request to cancel an existing Type 2 claims control record. A type 4 request must immediately be sent to FCCC whenever a benefit year involving Federal civilian and/or Federal military wages has been withdrawn or cancelled.

Note: Once a Type 2 claims control record is on file at FCCC if the benefit year effective date or separation date changes the State must send a Type 4 to cancel the Type 2 on file. A new Type 1 is necessary when the effective date, branch of service or base period changes, then a new Type 2.

- **Type 5** - Request to cancel an existing Type 3 claims control record. A type 5 request must immediately be sent to FCCC whenever a Federal wage assignment only (type 3) record must be cancelled.

NOTE: Don't forget to review your Type 4 or Type 5 responses to make sure the record was deleted.



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

Type 6 - Request to cancel a UCX “pending record” due to error or withdrawn /cancelled claim. A Type 6 request must immediately be sent to FCCC to cancel a “pending record”. The pending record remains active until the needed service discharge form DD214 is received at the FCCC or the state sends a Type 6 record.

Note: A UCX pending record is created automatically when the FCCC receives a Type 1 request for Federal military information but does not have a matching DD214 or DD215 on file and has advised the State of this via a Type 1 response. Should a State discover that they sent the wrong separation date on the Type 1 request which caused a “pending record” to be created, a Type 6 record must be sent to cancel the erroneous “pending record” at the HUB as well as a new Type 1 request with the corrected separation date.



FCCC Request Processing Overview (cont'd)

When a 'J'oint (UCFE & UCX) Claim is established:

For a 'J'oint claim, the Filing State must send two (2) Type 1 requests to FCCC

- Type 1 request with program type = 'F' and UCFE separation date
- Type 1 request with program type = 'X' and UCX separation date

The FCCC does NOT accept a 'J'oint type 1 request, it will be rejected and returned as an Error, if the State does NOT send a correct Type 1 it will never receive the official UCX wage and separation information.

Once the benefit year has been established:

- The Paying State must send a Type 2 request with program type 'J'oint. The Type 2 will include both UCX and UCFE separation dates (fields 7 & 8). The system will not allow a Type 2 program type 'X' and a Type 2 program type 'F' that have the same BYE. The second control record will be rejected as an error.



FCCE Response Handling

Important fields to check when reviewing a response:

Message #'s (fields #103 – 114)
Edit / Process flag (field #118)

The response MAY include:

Separation Pay (field #74)
Disability Pension Pay (field #75)

Each State must decide how they will handle Separation and/or Disability Pay



FCCC Response Handling (cont'd)

If the Edit/Process Flag contains an 'E'

- the record was rejected because of severe errors and was not accepted for processing.
- All response records with an 'E' in the Edit/Process Flag require manual intervention. These errors need to be reviewed, corrected and re-submitted.

If the Edit/Process Flag contains an 'P'

- 'P' means the record was accepted and was processed through the system. All messages must be reviewed for possible issues in order to determine proper claim filing options.



FCCC Response Handling (cont'd)

The Edit/Process Flag in conjunction with the Error Message # is what determines the corresponding verbal description (see UIPL 47-01)

There are 41 possible process messages and 34 possible error messages.

The UCX-UCFE & FCCC Design Guide includes a list of ALL message #'s and a verbal description for each.

Each State must decide the best method to display response records to staff members.

- A sample program was provided to the States (at the time of migration) to format a response into a printed report
- SWA may decide to write their own program and display on a screen or print a report



FCCC EXCEPTIONS WEB

FCCC Exceptions is a website to request a copy of a DD214 on file at FCCC. In addition, when FCCC processes a response that meets one or more of the following conditions an image of the DD214 is added to the FCCC Exceptions website:

- **More than two DD214s on file**
- **Wages must be reduced by days lost on DD214**
- **Used one of two SSNs to calculate (Overlapping Dates)**
- **Separation pay greater than 999,999.99**
- **Character of Service is NA**



FCCC FAQ'S

State rec'd a Type 1 UCX response w/calculated wages & msg P028 Request Sep Date MM/DD/YY is different from DD214 Sep Date. Pending record created. What does this mean?

It means the DD214 sep date does NOT match the State Type 1 request sep date therefore FCCC has created a pending record and will continue to contact the military branch on your behalf to request the DD214 for the sep date in your Type 1 request.

If the State determines their Type 1 sep date was wrong and the DD214 sep date is correct they should send a Type 6 UCX to cancel the pending record. In this case, a new Type 1 is NOT necessary because FCCC has already calculated and sent you the wages you need.



- Each State must have a method of printing or displaying responses.
- The next 4 slides are sample printed responses using model code.
- This program is available to all States for use on an IBM mainframe.
- If your State is NOT using model code your print out (if any) may look different but should provide the same detailed information.

1st scenario is a situation with UCX and in-State covered employment in 2 States



UCX COMBINED WAGE CLAIM SCENARIO

- **Claimant work history:**
 - WI covered employment 5-1-21 – 11-1-22
 - Army 12-10-21 – 3-29-22
 - MI covered employment 8-1-22 – 12-8-22
- **On 12-10-21, while in MI, claimant contacted WI to file a claim (since the claimant was physically in MI when he filed his claim that means the UCX wages must be assigned to MI).**
- **The claimant has MI & WI wages therefore under the Combined Wage rules he has a choice of filing:**
 - Straight MI claim,
 - Straight WI claim
 - Combined Wage Claim in MI or WI.
- **The claimant chose to file a CWC in WI.**
- **WI sends a UCX Type 1 request to FCCC (the purpose of the UCX Type 1 request is to find out if another State has already taken assignment of the UCX wages.)**



UCX COMBINED WAGE CLAIM SCENARIO (cont'd)

- WI receives a UCX Type 1 response with message P002 No Control Record or DD214 on file. Response Pending.
- After reviewing the FCCC response, WI knows the UCX wages are available, they also know the claimant is physically in MI therefore they need to request the UCX wages from MI but 1st they need to send FCCC a UCX Type 6 to cancel the pending record.

Note: It is important to review FCCC responses because they vary depending on what is on file at FCCC. (ex) The FCCC response could be a Type 2 showing UCX wages already assigned in which case WI would need to investigate that assignment before proceeding.

It is also possible that the DD214 could be on file at FCCC in which case WI would have received a UCX Type 1 response with UCX wage and separation information in which case WI would NOT need to send FCCC a UCX Type 6 but they would need to send MI the IB4 request.

- WI sends MI an IB4 request to transfer UCX wages as well as MI in-state covered wages. IB4 should include a comment explaining they are requesting UCX wages.

Note: a comment on an IB4 request means it should be handled manually.



UCX COMBINED WAGE CLAIM SCENARIO (cont'd)

- Upon receipt of IB4 request, MI sends FCCC a UCX Type 1 request and receives a UCX Type 1 response with wages. Note: MI must be able to send FCCC a UCX Type 1 request even though they are NOT the Paying State.
- MI reviews the FCCC response and determines the UCX wages are usable, they add the UCX base period wages along with the MI in-state covered base period wages to the IB4 response and send it to the WI.
- WI adds the transferred wages (MI & UCX) to the WI wages and sends FCCC a UCX Type 2 with MI in the Transferring State FIPS.
- WI sends MI an IB5 to show the UCX wages and MI wages as used. UCX is separated from MI and billed separately.

Note: As the Transferring State in a CWC, when the UCX separation date is after the base period end date, the Transferring State must send FCCC a UCX Type 3 to take assignment of the LAG UCX wages that are NOT being used by the Paying State.



2nd scenario is a recent UCX separation and no other employment



100% UCX SCENARIO

- Claimant recently separated from the military. He has 10 years of active service.
- While physically in RI he filed a new claim in RI.

Note: this means the UCX wages are assignable to RI.

- RI sends FCCC a UCX Type 1 request and FCCC responded with a UCX Type 1 with msg P002 (No control record or DD214 on file. Response Pending.)
- Claimant also filed in 9 other States. 5 of the 9 States sent FCCC a UCX Type 1 request and received a UCX Type 1 response with msg P001 (Prior Request. Response Pending.) Only 2 States reviewed the FCCC response, contacted RI and subsequently cancelled their claim. The other 3 never reviewed the FCCC response to their Type 1. The remaining 4 States took an affidavit and established a monetarily eligible UCX benefit year.



100% UCX SCENARIO (cont'd)

- RI took an affidavit and sent a UCX Type 2 to FCCC. RI received a UCX Type 2 response with msg P023 (Control Record Accepted.) Later, upon receipt of the DD214, FCCC sent RI an amended UCX Type 1 with the “official” UCX wage and separation information.
- 3 of the 5 States that received the UCX Type 1 response with msg P001 (Prior Request. Response Pending) ignored the response, proceeded to take an affidavit, established a monetarily eligible UCX benefit year and sent FCCC a UCX Type 2. FCCC rejected the Type 2 and responded by returning a copy of the RI UCX Type 2 with msg P015 (Wages Previously Assigned.) The States ignored the FCCC response.

Note: the Type 2 included the RI claim information so after reviewing the FCCC response each State should have contacted RI to ask the status of the RI claim.

End result is...the claimant was simultaneously receiving UI payments from 8 States, solely because 7 States ignored the FCCC response or worse yet never sent FCCC a request.

UCFE & COVERED EMPLOYMENT IN SAME STATE

- Claimant work history:
 - UCFE 12-10-21 – 4-3-22
 - AK covered employment 5-1-21 – 11-1-21
- Claimant resides in AK and on 4-9-22 files a claim in AK
- Last official UCFE duty station was AK
- Claimant has NO subsequent covered employment in AK therefore UCFE is assignable to AK
- AK sends FCCC a UCFE Type 1 and receives a response showing UCFE wages NOT assigned anywhere
- AK sends ETA 931 to Federal agency and receives a response
- AK files an InTRAstate claim which includes UCFE wages
- AK sends FCCC a Type 2 taking assignment of the UCFE wages with separation 4-3-22 (both base period and LAG)



UCFE & COVERED EMPLOYMENT IN SAME STATE UCFE IN LAG PERIOD ONLY

- Claimant work history:
 - UCFE in AK 3-8-22– 4-8-22
 - AK covered employment 5-1-19 – 3-4-22
- Claimant resides in AK and on 4-9-22 files a claim in AK
- Last official UCFE duty station was AK with no subsequent covered employment in AK therefore UCFE is assignable to AK
- UCFE work history was the past 30 days only (outside of B/P)
- AK sends FCCC a UCFE Type 1 and receives a response showing UCFE wages NOT assigned
- AK files an InTRAstate claim
- AK sends an ETA 931 to Federal employer and receives wages.
- AK stores the UCFE wages for possible future use and sends FCCC a Type 3 to take assignment of the LAG UCFE wages



COVERED EMPLOYMENT IN FILING STATE, AND UCFE IN ANOTHER STATE. Claimant chooses InTRAsate

- Claimant work history:
 - UCFE in WV 12-1-21 – 4-1-22
 - VA covered employment 5-1-20 – 11-20-22
- Claimant resides in VA and on 4-6-22 files a claim in VA
- Last official UCFE duty station was WV
- Claimant has NO subsequent covered employment in VA therefore UCFE is assignable to WV
- VA sends FCCC a UCFE Type 1 and receives a response showing UCFE wages NOT assigned
- VA is at maximum benefit rights without UCFE (or possibly the claimant decided he/she did NOT want to file a CWC)
- VA files an InTRAsate claim using VA covered employment
- VA must notify WV (UImail or telephone) that they established a claim so that WV may send an ETA 931 to the UCFE employer. Once they receive the wages they will store the wages for possible future use and send FCCC a Type 3 to take assignment of the LAG UCFE wages



COVERED EMPLOYMENT IN FILING STATE, AND UCFE IN ANOTHER STATE.

Claimant chooses CWC

- Claimant work history:
 - UCFE in WV 3-9-21– 4-1-22
 - VA covered employment 5-1-19 – 3-2-22
- Claimant resides in VA and on 4-9-22 files a claim in VA
- Last official UCFE duty station was WV
- Claimant has NO subsequent covered employment in VA therefore UCFE is assignable to WV
- VA sends FCCC a UCFE Type 1 and receives a response showing UCFE wages NOT assigned
- VA files a CWC claim and sends WV an IB4 request to transfer UCFE wages



COVERED EMPLOYMENT IN FILING STATE, AND UCFE IN ANOTHER STATE

Claimant chooses CWC (cont'd)

- WV sends FCCC a UCFE Type 1 and receives a response showing UCFE wages NOT assigned
- WV sends Federal employer an ETA 931 and receives a response
- WV transfers the base period UCFE wages to VA via IB4 response and since the UCFE separation date is after the VA base period end date WV stores the Federal LAG wages for possible future use and sends FCCC a Type 3 to take assignment of LAG period wages.
- VA adds the WV UCFE wages to their claim and sends FCCC a Type 2 showing WV as the Transferring State
- VA sends WV an IB5 showing FE wages as being used in VA

NOTE: If the VA IB5 returned the UCFE wage, then WV would have to send FCCC a Type 5 to cancel the LAG period only wages assignment
