UI PLAIN LANGUAGE INITIATIVE

Through a USDOL equity grant, NDOL partnered with the American Institutes for Research and NASWA/CESER to incorporate plain language into UI communication materials. AIR is using human-centered design to decrease reading levels and increase customer compliance and understanding of requirements and processes.



WORKFORCE RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM

Using ARPA funds, NDOL awarded \$10 million in grants for recruitment and retention of healthcare workers, as well as educators in math, science, career and technical education, and early childhood education. Grants also went toward workforce development projects to provide employment-related services to workers.














EDUCATION LEVELS (Age 25 & older)





