STRATEGIC ENFORCEMENT FOR WAGE AND HOUR LAW COMPLIANCE

In addition to the traditional processes of responding to worker complaints, NJDOL added the Office of Strategic Enforcement and Compliance to conduct targeted, proactive enforcement and outreach in industries with a history of non-compliance and whose employees are less likely to file complaints. 





EDUCATION LEVELS (Age 25 & older) Less than high school High school


