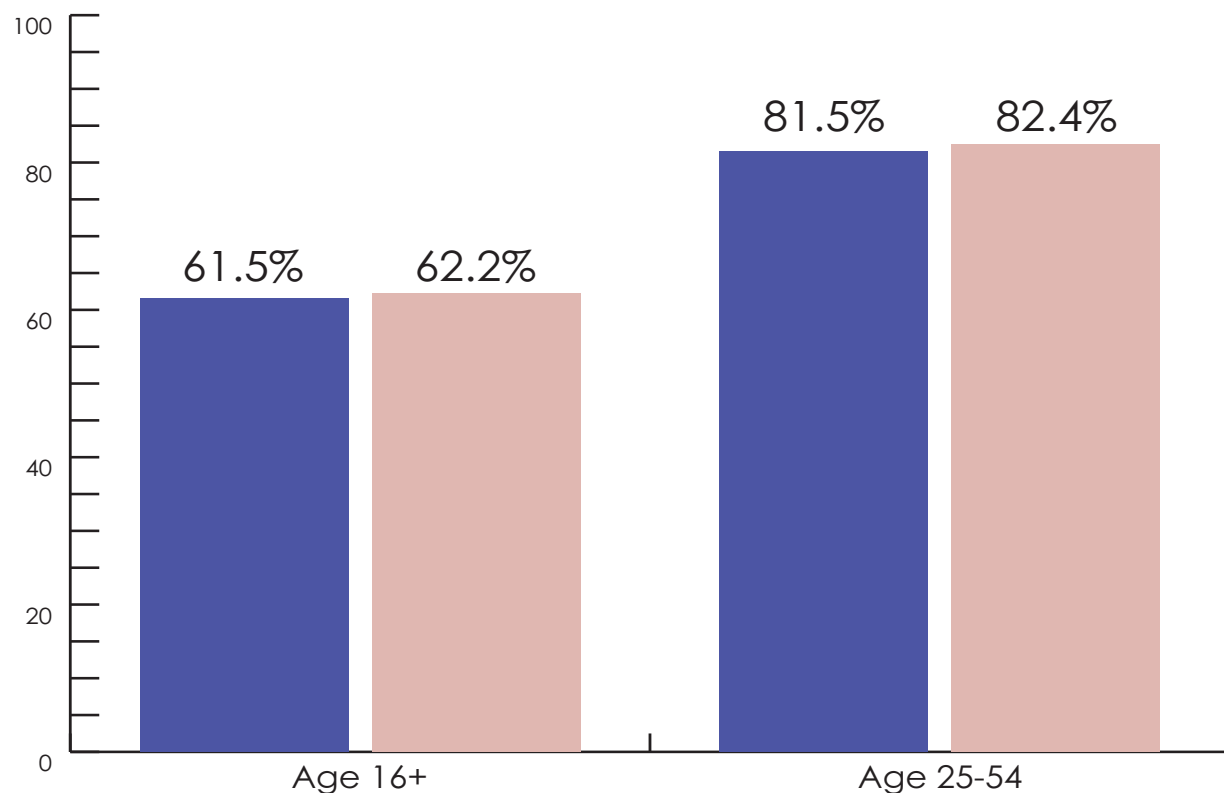

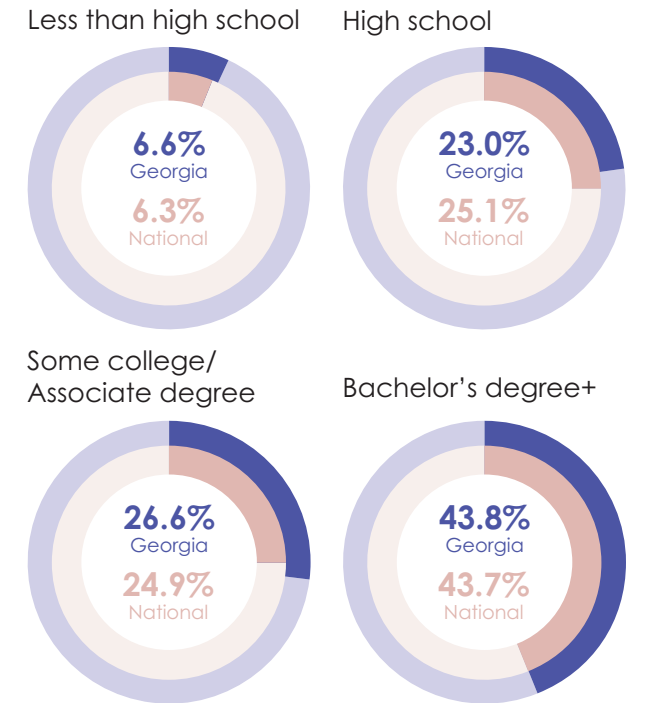

#### NUMBER OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT REGIONS

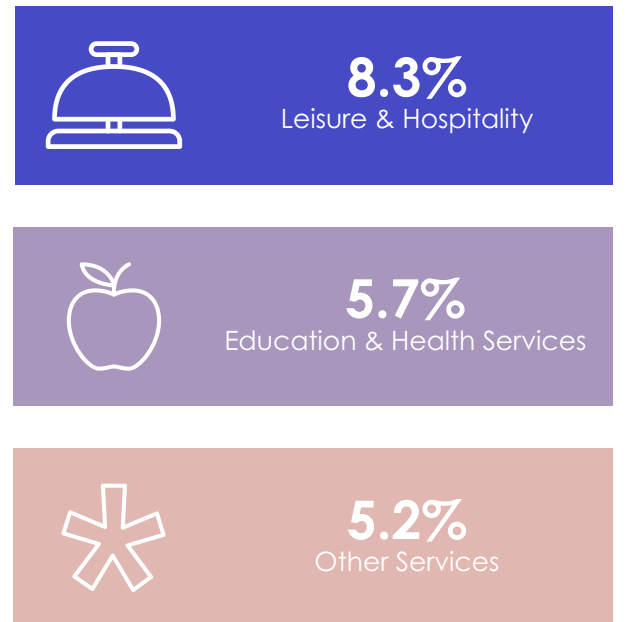

#### UNEMPLOYMENT DATA

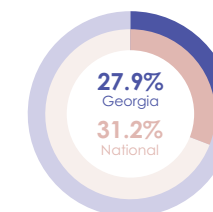
##### Duration Rate (Q4 CY22)
