

NATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

As the U.S. labor market continues its recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and employers confront historically high labor shortages, state workforce agencies are deploying innovative policies, programs, and initiatives across a broad range of areas to support and strengthen America's workforce.

From a new workforce development program to support the nation's burgeoning offshore wind sector to a collaborative healthcare training initiative, state workforce agencies are establishing and scaling innovative models to connect jobseekers with employment opportunities, upskill workers in in-demand industries, and support businesses with their ever-growing talent needs. Here are a few of the areas experiencing a flurry of state activity:

- apprenticeship programs
- reentry initiatives
- sector-focused training strategies

State workforce agencies are also implementing several **tech modernization** efforts to improve service delivery, strengthen internal operations, and better engage the American public. Examples include the following:

- modernization of state unemployment insurance systems
- adoption of artificial intelligence tools to support customers
- launch of new grants management systems

These tech efforts often are paired with **strategic initiatives to improve the customer experience**. A few initiatives that represent many promising developments on this front are:

- a new customer experience division
- tailored human-centered design efforts
- upgraded mobile apps

States are also advancing innovative strategies to **increase the visibility of the public workforce system**, better engage underserved communities, and meet customers where they are. Examples of this include:

- building partnerships with community-based organizations
- establishing new diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) initiatives
- promoting workforce development services during Workforce Development Month

On the data front, states are leveraging workforce and labor market information in new ways to support jobseekers, engage the business community, and inform policy development. Examples of this include:

- new labor market visualization tools
- launch of a state labor force participation task force
- dashboards to support individuals with career navigation

States are also innovating in areas as varied as **enforcing wage** and hour laws, improving paid family and medical leave programs, and expanding access to high-speed internet service.

Taken together, these initiatives highlight the dedication state workforce agencies have to strengthening America's workforce, supporting employers across all sectors, and driving economic growth over the long-term.


PUTTING ALABAMA TO WORK JOB FAIR SERIES


ALASKA ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM HAS PARTNERED WITH THE ALASKA LITERACY




PARTNERS FOR REENTRY OPPORTUNITIES IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT (PROWD) GRANT







PARTNERSHIP WITH USPS OFFERS ID PROOFING AT **POST OFFICES**

ADWS, USDOL, and USPS partnered to offer UI claimants the option to provide the proof of ID needed to finalize a claim at post offices. The program aims to reduce fraud while ensuring eligible claimants receive benefits regardless of their location or access to technology.



VIRTUAL SIGN IN FOR JOB FAIR ATTENDEE FOLLOW UP

ADWS created an online sign-in form for job fair attendees. To open the form, attendees scan a QR code. Some Workforce Centers set up iPad kiosks for attendees to use. Staff utilize the information collected to follow up with attendees and offer employment services.



NEW COST ALLOCATION SYSTEM


ADWS worked to modernize and automate its cost allocation and reporting processes using SAP S/4HANA Cloud, an enterprise resource planning platform.


PARTICIPANTS SERVED BY ARKANSAS' WORKEORCE


WORK SHARING OUTREACH CAMPAIGN





CTDOL'S UNEMPLOYED WORKERS' ADVOCATE

CTDOL's Unemployed Workers' Advocate is a new unit designed to reduce barriers unemployment benefits. Through 1:1 case management, UWA staff assists filers navigating benefits, appeals, and complex claims. Since 2022, the unit has handled nearly 1,600 cases, 38% of which are referrals from legislative offices, portal.ct.gov/dol/divisions/unemployed-workersadvocate?language=en US



REEMPLOYCT

In July 2022, CTDOL launched ReEmployCT, Connecticut's new unemployment tax and benefits system. ReEmployCT replaced CTDOL's 40-year-old legacy systems and streamlines processes for filers and employers. New work-search requirements, direct referrals, and reemployment activities reduced overall benefits paid by \$150M and the average benefits duration from 13 to 9.7 weeks, the lowest since 1967.





The Kansas Office of Registered Apprenticeship celebrated the one-year anniversary of the establishment of the office in September 2023. Registered Apprenticeship has continued to grow, with 12 new programs created this year, 49 new occupations created, and a 37% increase of the number of apprentices in the State of Kansas.



WORK BASED LEARNING (WBL) INTERMEDIARIES

Kansas Work Based Learning Project is a comprehensive approach that ensures students have equitable access to high quality work-based learning experiences designed to prepare each student for postsecondary, workforce success, in high demand and critical need occupations. 
ReSpectworks - Expanded relationship with the Kansas department of corrections

ReSpECTWORKS (Reentry Specialized Employment Counseling and Training) provides "inside-outside" services to eligible incarcerated individuals from every adult correctional facility. Career Navigators provide intensive case management to assess barriers and needs, explore career interests and opportunities, foster connections to education/training, job readiness programming and other community-based supports. During this year, ReSpECTWORKS tripled its enrollment from 87 participants to 263. To date, 79% of participants released to the community have obtained employment.



Through a USDOL equity grant, NDOL partnered with the American Institutes for Research and NASWA/CESER to incorporate plain language into UI communication materials. 




VIRTUAL JOB FAIRS






