ALASKA CAREER GUIDE INITIATIVE

The Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development (DOLWD), with the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development, has placed career guides in rural Alaska school districts. Serving five rural Aslaska school districts, the program seeks to engage youth about career awareness, and identification of pathways after completion of secondary education, skills development and the financial aid process. The Initiative has partnered with rootED Alliance, a national nonprofit.



UNEMPLOYMENT DATA


Average Duration
