ARKANSAS LAUNCH

Arkansas LAUNCH is a free, state-run website connecting jobseekers and employers that focuses on skills-based hiring and personalized career paths while helping UI claimants manage and track work search activities. The platform was created in partnership with the nonprofit RIPL, Walmart and Google.org and launched February 2025 by Governor Sanders. launch.arkansas.gov



STATE APPRENTICESHIP AGENCY ACT

In March 2025, the Arkansas General Assembly passed legislation establishing the State Apprenticeship Agency Act (Act 695). This designates Workforce Connections as Arkansas' official State Apprenticeship Agency and grants it the authority to register and oversee apprenticeship programs while allowing it to better tailor programs to meet workforce needs.



LABOR FORCE DATASET

The Division of Workforce Policy & Innovation created a labor force dataset in partnership with the Arkansas GIS Office to produce custom maps for communities and regions. The data layer shows the total civilian labor force, number of employed and unemployed, and the unemployment rate for each county in Arkansas.
