### FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE INSURANCE IMPLEMENTATION

Colorado launched its Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) program in 2024. FAMLI processed about 135,000 claims and distributed \$687 million in its first year. 97% of claims are filed online via My FAMLI+, which was recognized nationally for its human-centered design. famli.colorado.gov



### TEACHER EXTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Colorado's teacher externship program serves as a bridge between education and industry. In 2024, 37 teacher externs immersed themselves with STEM-based employers to bring real-world applications back to their classrooms. ### APPRENTICESHIP FUNDING INCENTIVES

Apprenticeship Colorado is breaking down funding barriers to expand registered apprenticeship programs across the state. In FY2025, Apprenticeship Colorado awarded \$1.59 million to organizations to support the expansion of apprenticeships. These incentives played a part in adding 101 apprenticeships in FY2024, and Colorado is on track to add another 100 in FY2025. apprenticeship.colorado.gov



(Age 25 & older)


