Provides employer recruitment assistance, coordinates and promotes job fairs; hosts virtual seminars on a wide range of topics impacting employers including paid leave, cannabis and the workplace, and others. Coordinates with employers and WDBs to host statewide job fairs for federal and high-level employees.



MULTI-AGENCY INTIATIVES

CTDOL works with other state agencies and organizations on a variety of workforce development intiatives. In 2025, the agency partnered with the CT Department of Transportation to build out a Transportation Maintainer Apprenticeship Pipeline. Additionally, the agency works with education, healthcare, and childcare sector organizations to recruit and train new workers.




ECONOMIC DIGEST


