STEMM-UP PROGRAM

Michigan's Rehabilitation Services' STEMM-Up program is free to help job seekers with disabilities prepare for careers in science, technology, engineering, mathematics and medicine. It includes skill-building, onsite work experience, coaching and job shadowing to help qualified candidates find a new job or grow in their current one. CLAIMANT ROADMAP AND EMPLOYER HELP CENTER

UIA delivers accessible, clear and transparent resources that promote a better understanding of unemployment for claimants, employers and the public. The UIA Claimant Roadmap is a six-step guide to filing and understanding benefits. The Employer Help Center, an online toolkit to guide employers through unemployment tax, claim and workforce program information. The third is the interactive UIA Economic Dashboard, which tracks underlying trends in unemployment insurance while serving as a public resource.


MICHIGAN STATEWIDE INFRASTRUCTURE WORKFORCE PLAN


The plan is a framework for creating and enhancing job opportunities and training programs to meet Michigan's critical infrastructure needs. Developed by the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) in partnership with the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT); Michigan Department for Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE); and Michigan Infrastructure Office (MIO) — it will help facilitate the training of 5,000 new infrastructure workers by 2030. 




