Their efforts helped create a more inclusive, skill-building experience that prepares participants for success in the workforce.



INVESTING IN PENNSYLVANIA'S FUTURE WORKFORCE THROUGH CTE AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Governor Shapiro and L&I have increased funding for vo-tech, career and technical education (CTE), and apprenticeships by nearly \$65 million—a 50% boost since taking office. These historic investments are expanding access to hands-on training, strengthening career pathways, and preparing Pennsylvanians for in-demand jobs across industries critical to the Commonwealth's economic future.




DELIVERING FASTER, FAIRER UC SERVICE THROUGH IN-PERSON ASSISTANCE AND MODERNIZED SUPPORT

Now in its third year, UC Connect has helped more than 106,000 Pennsylvanians access in-person unemployment assistance at PA CareerLink® sites. Under Governor Shapiro's leadership, average UC call wait times have dropped below 20 minutes, and sustained investments have expanded staffing, modernized access, and embedded equity into the Commonwealth's UC service model.




